Why in the News?

 Prajith Jayapal from Kerala is a very well-known disability rights activist. He plans to drive cross-world and document how different countries are making it easy for people with disabilities.

Key Points:

- Prajith Jayapal, paralysed from the neck below after an accident in 2011 at Kozhikode bypass, has dedicated his life to inspiring people with disabilities; finding modern technologies to support them and raising awareness in society about inclusiveness.
- Now, Prajith Jayapal is on a quest, named Drive for Disabled (D4D), to drive to Six continents, 84 countries, 80,000 kilometres within 400 days.
- He will be the first disabled person from the state to try such a cross-world trip driving by himself.

Mid-day Meal Crisis: Delay in fund release affecting noon meal scheme in Kerala schools

Why in the News?

- Kerala State government is yet to provide the noon meal funds for June, July, and August.
- The noon-meal scheme in schools across Kerala has been quite a success despite fund shortage.

Do you know?

- The expenditure on the noon-meal scheme is shared by the Centre and State on a 60:40 ratio.
- The Centre will not release its share of the funds without the State submitting the statement of accounts for the money released for the past months.
- Funds are released each time only after the accounts of the previous installment are submitted.

Invasive aquatic species posing a huge challenge for Kerala

What is an invasive species and why are they a problem?

- Invasive species are non-native species that have colonised a new area to the point of damaging the surrounding environment and are seen as one of the top five major threats to our ecosystem today.
- Invasive species are capable of causing extinctions of native plants and animals, reducing biodiversity, competing with native organisms for limited resources, and altering habitats.

	 According to a study, After the 2018 floods, Kerala is home to more than 32 alien fish species and a few alien aquatic weeds. Most of these are originally from South, central and North America, southeast Asia and China. As per experts, management and eradication of alien species in the water bodies is a huge challenge as it is comparatively easier to manage an invasion on land than on waters.
Alien specie has wiped out clams and oysters from Kerala lakes: Study	 Key points: As per report by Intergovernmental Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) - Invasive alien specie, the Caribbean false mussel, has wiped out native clams and oysters from the lakes of Kerala. The Caribbean false mussel, scientifically known as Mytilopsis sallei, was originally from the Atlantic and Pacific coast of South and Central America but has spread widely. Researchers fear that the tropical cylone Ockhi, which struck the Kerala coast in 2017, may have triggered the spread of the 'Varathan Kakka' (alien bivalve mollusc' in Malayalam) across the state by carrying it into new waters.
Intergovernmental Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES)	 What is IBPES? It is an independent intergovernmental body, established by member States in 2012. It strengthens the science-policy interface for biodiversity and ecosystem services for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, long-term human well-being and sustainable development. Do you know? Invasive Alien Species Assessment was recently released by IPBES.
Agritourism park to come up at Ezhikkara	 Key Points: Agritourism park to come up at Ezhikkara near North Paravur. Palliyakkal Cooperative Bank is mooting the project so as to attract domestic and foreign tourists. The park will provide facilities for the tourists to stay in the area and study about the agricultural practices in Ezhikkara. The motto of Palliyakkal Cooperative Bank is to promote tourism along with agriculture.
