#### In News: ICMR honour for Amrita Hospital

- The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has recognised Amrita Hospital, Kochi, as a collaborative centre of excellence in the domain of venomous snakebite.
- The hospital also got the Centre of Excellence award from the ICMR director general for the whole paediatric heart programme.

#### Collaborative centre of Excellence for snakebite:

- It **aims** to address several aspects related to snakebite envenoming, including:
- 1. Developing information, education, and communication (IEC) material to create awareness on prevention and first aid for snakebites
- 2. Capacity building of the public health care system for prevention
- 3. First aid, diagnosis, and management of snakebite envenoming
- 4. Conducting high-priority research on snakebite envenomation
- 5. Networking with stakeholders involved in addressing issues related to snakebite envenoming envenomation and its mitigation
- 6. Providing policy inputs to the state and Central government to reduce mortality and morbidity associated with snakebite envenomation.
