Indian Coast Guard Day

 Indian Coast Guard Day is celebrated annually on February 1st to commemorate the formation of the Indian Coast Guard in 1977.

This vital organization plays a crucial role in safeguarding India's maritime interests, including:

- 1. **Maritime Security:** Guarding against piracy, terrorism, and illegal activities at sea.
- Search and Rescue: Conducting rescue operations during maritime emergencies and saving lives.
- 2. **Environmental Protection:** Preventing marine pollution and enforcing environmental regulations.
- 3. **Fisheries Protection:** Combating illegal fishing and protecting marine resources.
- 4. **Disaster Relief:** Providing assistance during natural disasters and coastal emergencies.

New guidelines after ASER 2023 report

Context:

- The Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) 2023 report, focusing on Nanded district as a representative for Maharashtra, revealed worrying deficiencies in Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) skills among 14-18-year-olds in government schools.
- To address these concerns, the Maharashtra State School Education Department issued new guidelines.

PM Narendra Modi to Be Honored with Shiv Sanman Award

 Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to be honored with the prestigious Shiv Samman Award on February 19, 2024

- It coincides with the birth anniversary of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, the legendary Maratha warrior king.
- The award, instituted by the Satara royal family and Shiv devotees, recognizes individuals who embody the ideals of Shivaji Maharaj, including bravery, leadership

Vidarbha has huge potential to attract industries

 Union Minister Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari said that Maharashtra's Vidarbha region has the potential to attract investments and asserted that Gadchiroli will become the highest taxpaying district in the State in five years

About:

- The region is bordered by the state of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, and the Marathwada and Khandesh regions of Maharashtra.
- Vidarbha region comprises 11 districts in total: Amravati, Akola, Bhandara, Buldhana, Chandrapur, Gadchiroli, Gondia, Nagpur, Wardha, Washim, and Yavatmal. Nagpur, the largest of them all, and Gadchiroli, home to a fossil park.
- Vidarbha region is known for its rich biodiversity and is home to several wildlife parks and sanctuaries - Some of them are Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve, one of the largest and oldest national parks in Maharashtra; Pench National Park, one of the premier national parks and tiger reserves in the country; Melghat Tiger Reserve; Navegaon Nagzira National Park; and Tipeshwar Wildlife Sanctuary.

Agricultural conversion and afforestation destroys savanna biodiversity in MH

- Savannas are unique ecosystems with a balance of trees and grasses, crucial for biodiversity and local communities.
- Maharashtra hosts diverse savannas with endemic plants and grazing grounds for pastoral communities.



Threats to Savanna Biodiversity

- Replacing 1. Agricultural conversion: savannas with intensive tillage agriculture destroys native plants and disrupts ecological balance.
- 2. Afforestation: Converting savannas to tree plantations, aiming for forest restoration or carbon sequestration, can unintentionally harm savanna-adapted species.

Impacts:

- 1. Loss of native species: Keystone perennial grasses and other flora crucial for the ecosystem are eliminated.
- 2. Degradation of habitat: Fragmented landscapes and altered soil properties hinder natural recovery.
- Livelihoods affected: Dhangar communities 3. depending on savannas for grazing lose vital resources.

World Wetlands Day 2024

- World Wetlands Day is celebrated annually on February 2nd
- It aims to raise global awareness about the vital role of wetlands for both people and the planet.
- It also commemorates the signing of the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands in 1971, an international treaty for the conservation and wise use of wetlands.
- The theme for 2024 is: "Wetlands and **Human Wellbeing**"
- It focuses on the interconnectedness between wetlands and various aspects of human wellbeing, including physical, mental and environmental health

About:

Wetlands are ecosystems where water saturates the land for extended periods, creating unique habitats for diverse plants and animals.

Examples include marshes, swamps, bogs, mangroves, and even rice paddies.

Did you Know?

- The state of Tamil Nadu (14) has the most Ramsar sites in India. followed by the state of Uttar Pradesh with 10 sites.
- India currently has 80 sites designated as Wetlands of International Importance (Ramsar Sites).

CSMIA registers 87% YOY growth of ecommerce shipments

Context:

- Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA) in Mumbai experienced an impressive 87% year-on-year (YOY) growth in e-commerce shipments during the festive season of 2023.
- This surge is attributed to the growing popularity of online shopping and the increased demand for faster deliveries.
- Perishable items saw a significant rise, with mango exports witnessing a record-breaking 318% growth, reaching 4,700 metric tons.
- This growth highlights the critical role of airports in supporting the e-commerce ecosystem and the need for efficient cargo handling infrastructure.

Maha to implement 'Vatsalya' to reduce mother & child mortality

- Inorder to reduce mother and child mortality, the state government is set to implement the 'Vatsalya' programme in Maharashtra
- It will be done by integrating various maternal- and child- care programmes.
- Under this first-of-its-kind programme, pregnancy and postpartum care will be provided to the mother and child up to three years post-delivery





Rs 798 crore for Mumbai railway infrastructure works

- The Indian government allocated Rs 798 crore in the interim budget for ongoing capacity expansion projects in Mumbai's Western and Central Railways under Mumbai Urban Transport Projects (MUTP).
- This allocation aims to improve Mumbai's suburban railway network, a crucial lifeline for millions of commuters.
- Specific projects funded might include additional platforms, new lines, and rolling stock upgrades.

Bullet train gets Rs 25000 crore in interim budget

- The budget allocated Rs 25,000 crore to India's first High-Speed Rail (HSR) corridor, the bullet train project connecting Mumbai and Ahmedabad.
- This is a significant boost for the project, facing land acquisition delays and cost escalations.
- The funds will likely be used for civil works contracts and further project development.

BMC Unveils Rs 59,954 Crore Budget for 2024-25, Marking 10.5% Increase

- The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) presented its budget for the fiscal year 2024-25, outlining a significant 10.5% increase from the previous year.
- The total budget stands at Rs. 59,954 crore, showcasing ambitious plans for Mumbai's development.
- The focus lies on enhancing infrastructure, public services, and overall quality of life for residents.
- Estimated revenue income for 2024-25 is Rs. 35,749 crore, indicating a Rs. 2,459 crore rise compared to the previous year's estimates.
- A surplus budget of Rs. 58.22 crore highlights the BMC's commitment to fiscal responsibility.

BMC announces ₹3,497.82 crore budget for education

 The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has presented a budget of ₹3,497.82

- **crore for the education sector** in its upcoming fiscal year.
- This marks a significant increase from the previous year's allocation, highlighting the BMC's commitment to improving educational opportunities for students in Mumbai.

Key highlights of the budget:

- Increased allocation for infrastructure development in schools and colleges.
- Focus on improving teacher training and recruitment.
- Introduction of new scholarship schemes for underprivileged students.
- Allocation for digitization initiatives in schools.
- Emphasis on promoting extracurricular activities and holistic development.

Boosting Green Public Transport: BEST Mumbai Receives ₹928 Crore for E-Buses

- The Brihanmumbai Electric Supply and Transport (BEST) Undertaking, which caters to over 30 lakh bus passengers daily, has been allocated a mere 1.5% of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation's (BMC) massive ₹59,954.75-crore budget for 2024-25.
- In the budget presented, the civic body allocated ₹928.65 crore to BEST, although the cash-strapped undertaking had sought ₹3,000 crore.
- The BMC's budget document considers BEST's financial position and proposes to give the undertaking ₹800 crore as a grant, and another ₹128.65 crore towards purchasing 2.000 electric buses.
- The grant will help BEST meet expenses towards infrastructure development, purchase of capital equipment, repayment of loans, payment to wet lease operators, employee expenses such as bonus and gratuity, dues of pensioners, electricity dues and so on.

Free higher education proposed for female students with family income below ₹8 lakh

 The state government has principally sanctioned the provision of free higher education to female students from families with incomes below ₹8 lakh





Currently, female students admitted under the Other Backward Classes (OBC) and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) categories receive a 50% fee waiver.

PM Modi to inaugurate partial stretch of Mumbai's coastal road on Feb 19

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to inaugurate a partial stretch of the highly anticipated coastal road project on February
- This opening marks a crucial milestone in addressing chronic traffic congestion in the

Project Details:

- **Inaugurated Segment**: The southbound lane, extending from Bindumadhav Thackeray Chowk in Worli to Marine Drive, will be officially opened to the public.
- Public Access: Following the inauguration, the southbound lane will become operational for public use starting February 20th
- **Project Scope:** The entire coastal road project comprises two phases:
- Phase 1 (Southbound): Currently being inaugurated, this 10.58 km stretch aims to ease traffic flow between Nariman Point and Marine Drive.
- Phase 2 (Northbound): Scheduled to open by May 15th, this 8-lane section features twin tunnels, further enhancing connectivity.
- **Project Cost:** The total project cost stands at an estimated ₹12,721 crore (₹13,983 crore according to some sources).

World Cancer Day

- World Cancer Day is observed annually on February 4th
- It was initiated on February 4, 2000, at the **World Summit Against Cancer for the New** Millennium in Paris.
- It aims to unite the world in the fight against cancer.
- Between 2022 and 2024, the focus of World Cancer Day is to help "Close the cancer gap."

- The theme for this year is "Together, we challenge those in power".
- This theme encompasses the global demand for leaders to prioritize and invest in cancer prevention and care and to do more to achieve a just and cancer-free world

About:

- Cancer is a complex group of diseases characterized by uncontrolled cell growth that can invade and damage surrounding tissues.
- It often arises from genetic mutations within cells, leading to abnormal proliferation and disruptions in the body's natural regulatory mechanisms.
- While cancer can affect any part of the body, various factors influence individual risk and specific types.

Panel for effective implementation of sickle cell disease programme

- The Maharashtra government has established a committee for the first time to ensure the effective implementation of the Sickle Cell Disease Control Programme.
- The state government has issued directives for the formation of committees at the state, district, and taluka levels
- It also assigns them the critical tasks of investigating, treating, and preventing sickle cell disease.
- This initiative is specifically tailored to address the healthcare needs of rural, remote, and tribal areas.

Open varsity signs MoUs for training of drone operators

- The Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU) has signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with several institutions to offer training programs for drone operators.
- It will be in line with the National Education Policy 2020 with the aim to provide all possible measures to develop skills of people that will increase their employability.





This initiative also aims to:

- Address the growing demand for skilled drone operators in various sectors.
- Provide accessible and affordable drone training to individuals across India.
- Equip trainees with the knowledge and skills to operate drones safely and effectively, complying with regulations.

BoM records highest growth in deposit mobilization among PSU banks in Q3

- Bank of Maharashtra has recorded the highest growth rate in terms of deposit mobilization among public sector lenders at a time when most lenders are facing difficulty in achieving double-digit growth.
- Out of 12 public sector banks, only Bank of Maharashtra and State Bank of India (could log a double-digit growth in deposits in the third quarter ended December 2023.
- The Pune-based lender Bank of Maharashtra reported a 17.895 growth in deposits followed by SBI at 12.84% during the quarter, according to published quarterly numbers of the public sector banks.

Olympian Dattu Bhokanal caps comeback with sprint single scull gold

- Dattu Bhokanal has won the men's singles scull gold in the National Sprint rowing championships at the Army Rowing Node.
- He is an Olympian and Asian Games gold medalist in quadruple scull, pipped Services rower Salman Khan by three-tenth of a second, crossing the finish line in 1 minute 29.5 seconds compared to the latter's 1:29.8, to claim the the title.

International Day of Zero Tolerance for Female Genital Mutilation

- The International Day of Zero Tolerance for female genital mutilation (FGM) is observed annually on 6 February.
- This provides an opportunity for all stakeholders involved in ending FGM to celebrate achievements, advocate for abandonment of the practice and raise awareness.
- 2024 Theme: Her Voice. Her Future

- This year marks the 13th anniversary of this international day.
- In 2024, nearly 4.4 million girls or more than 12,000 each day are at risk of FGM around the world.

Mascot of Pench Tiger Reserve

- Hori, a Malabar pied hornbill, has been chosen as the mascot for the Pench Tiger Reserve (PTR).
- Known as **Dhanesh in Marathi** and Dhan Chidiya by local tribals, the bird holds cultural significance in the region.
- The PTR management has officially named the mascot **"Hori"**.

Pench Tiger Reserve:

- Maharashtra, being the third largest state in India and a leader in protecting biodiversity, bears maximum numbers (six) of tiger reserves in India along with Madhya Pradesh.
- Pench Tiger Reserve situated in the northern part of eastern Vidarbha is spread in Ramtek, Parseoni and Saoner tehsil of Nagpur district.
- It is the 25th tiger reserve of India.
- The Pench Tiger reserve (PTR) which derives its name from its lifeline - the River Pench is spread over 741.41 Sq.km of area.

Government Initiatives to Combat Air Pollution

- In response to a directive from the Bombay High Court, the BMC introduced a new Android application named "Mumbai Air" to address complaints related to air pollution.
- The app's launch was part of the court's order to establish a website and mobile app for this purpose.

Establishment of State-Level Committee

- The state environment department has established a state-level committee aimed at devising strategies to alleviate the prevalent air pollution issues within the city.
- This move comes after the Bombay High Court, prompted by various reports and a Public Interest Litigation (PIL), mandated the enactment of legislation akin to the central Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act to





combat the alarming Air Quality Index (AQI) and pollution levels in Mumbai.

Thane's New Landmark

- Thane, known as the City of Lakes, is unveiling a new landmark, the Grand Central Park, spanning 20.5 acres in Kolshet.
- Chief Minister Eknath Shinde will inaugurate this public park on February 8.
- The Grand Central Park draws inspiration from iconic parks like New York's Grand Central Park and London's Hvde Park.
- It's a product of the Thane Municipal Corporation's Suvidha plot development project.
- Boasting over **3,500 tree species**, the park offers diverse amenities for visitors.
- It includes themed sections such as Mughal. Chinese. Moroccan, and Japanese gardens.
- The Grand Central Park stands as Thane's largest developed park among its 80-plus parks.

BMC Budget 2024-25

- The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has unveiled a budget of ₹59,954.75 crore for the financial year 2024-25, marking a notable increase of 10.5% compared to the previous fiscal year.
- The civic administration presented the budget to municipal commissioner Igbal Singh Chahal, who was appointed as BMC administrator by the state government after the five-year term of corporators ended in March 2022.

Major Green Initiative: Maharashtra to Convert 5000 Diesel Buses to LNG

- Maharashtra is undertaking an initiative to convert 5000 of its diesel buses to **Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG)**
- It marks a significant stride towards environmental sustainability and cleaner
- This will reduce diesel vehicle pollution by 10%.
- The conversion will be done in six phases, with a provision for LNG fuel in 90 stations across the state.

- In order to promote green transportation, the industry department has collaborated with Kings Gas Pvt.
- This transformative project is anticipated to vield substantial benefits, including:
 - Reduced Greenhouse Gas (GHG) **Emissions**
 - Improved Air Quality
 - **Enhanced Public Health**
 - **Economic Advantages**
 - **Energy Security**

Maharashtra Government Releases **Guidelines for Student Internships Across** Diverse Sectors

- Maharashtra govt issues guidelines for internships, student encouraging collaboration with industries, NGOs, and professionals.
- As per the National Education Policy, internships are mandatory for 8-12 credits.
- Each college is required to establish an internship cell, offering diverse opportunities and conducting preparatory programs.
- Students can list preferences, and colleges must select projects aligning with local industry needs.
- Alongside industries, NGOs, financial institutions, and banks, students can also pursue internships under professionals, such as chartered accountants, lawyers, or artists.
- After internships, students present comprehensive reports, promoting knowledge exchange.

Mumbai region reports 26% animal bites; rabies deaths rise 3-fold in Maharashtra

- The **Mumbai region** has seen a **significant** rise in animal bites, with a 26% increase reported in the past five years.
- WHO estimates that rabies kills 55,000 each year, including 20,000 from India.
- In 2023, Maharashtra registered 30 rabies deaths as compared to 10 in 2019.
- Maharashtra witnessed a concerning 3-fold increase in rabies deaths within the same period.





 Rabies is a vaccine-preventable viral disease that spreads from animal bites and is 100% fatal except in a couple of cases in the world.

Agency charge reduced to 1% from 5% for CC roads plan

- Despite concerns expressed by two members, the state cabinet has approved Rs 28,500 crore to construct 6,000km of cement concrete roads through the Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM).
- The state provides 30% of funds while 70% is raised by the concessionaire from the market.
- The concessionaire is Maharashtra State Infrastructure Development Corporation (MSIDC), formed last May under the public works department.

Green growth can drive Maha to meet \$1tn economy target

- The International Forum for Environment, Sustainability and Technology (iFOREST), a prominent environmental think tank, has called for a just energy transition in Maharashtra to support green growth and green jobs and to achieve a \$1 trillion economy in five years.
- iFOREST recently released a report at an event 'Just Energy Transition in Maharashtra: An Opportunity for Green Growth and Green Jobs'.
- The report, which is the first comprehensive assessment of challenges and opportunities of a green energy transition in the state, covers all major sectors that will be highly or moderately impacted in the years to come.
- It highlights opportunities for green growth and jobs which can be catalyzed through the right govt policy levers, and required private and public investments.

Pilot vaccination drive against Japanese Encephalitis for children from March

 The state health department, by march, will initiate a pilot vaccination drive against Japanese Encephalitis (JE) for children in four regions of Maharashtra including Pune city, Pimpri-Chinchwad, Raigad and Parbhani. The first phase of the JE vaccination for children was carried out a couple of years ago in 16 districts of Maharashtra including Gondia, Gadchiroli, Wardha, Solapur, Bhandara and Dharashiv among others.

About:

- Japanese encephalitis (JE) is a potentially life-threatening mosquito-borne viral infection primarily affecting the brain.
- The causative agent is the Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV), a member of the flavivirus family, closely related to dengue, yellow fever, and West Nile viruses.
- JEV is transmitted primarily through the bites of infected Culex mosquitoes, particularly active at dusk and dawn in rural areas.
- Pigs and wild birds serve as virus reservoirs, but direct transmission from person to person is not possible.

Tata Trusts to launch India's first small animal hospital in Mumbai

- Tata Trusts is set to launch India's first state-of-the-art Small Animal Hospital in Mahalaxmi, Mumbai.
- The hospital is a first-of-its-kind and spans over 98,000-square-foot, across 5 floors with a capacity of over 200 beds.
- Inspired by philanthropist and former Tata Group Chairman Ratan Tata's vision for a super speciality hospital for pets, the facility will provide round the clock services through pet-sensitized veterinarians, nurses and technicians trained to deliver quality care with a mission to save lives.
- The hospital will be launched in March 2024.

CM announces 837cr for Maha project on cybersecurity

- MH CM at the formal inauguration of the Maharashtra State Police Games 2024 (Feb 4 to Feb 10) in Nashik said that the govt has taken up a project worth Rs 837 crore to enhance the cybersecurity mechanism
- It includes command and control centre, technology-assisted investigation, centre of excellence, cloud based data centre, security



- operation centre for cybersecurity to enable the police to look into every angle and details of crimes to catch the culprits
- The state is committed to increasing the manpower in the police force for which it has recruited 17,000 policemen.
- The govt has also decided to start a loan scheme for construction of houses for police through banks as earlier.

Art of Living launches Kisan Basket, signs MoU with state to promote natural farming

- Global spiritual organization Art of Living Foundation launched Kisan Basket, a platform that will allow consumers to directly order from farmers.
- The Foundation signed an MoU with the state government to this effect in the presence of Art of Living founder Sri Sri Ravi Shankar.
- The organization said they are already implementing natural farming over 1.3 million hectares in the state to bring about holistic rural development.
- More than 10,000 tribal farmers have been trained around Sambhaji Nagar district in natural farming and sustainable agriculture. making them self-reliant.

Adani's Gondkhairi coal mine secures EC, path clear for pollution board application

- The Adani Group has got the environmental clearance (EC) from the ministry of forest environment and climate change (MOEFCC) for its underground coal mine at Gondkhairi in Kalmeshwar taluka, 20 km from the city.
- This is the first mine of Adani Group in Maharashtra.
- The EC paves the way for the company to apply for consent to operate before the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB).

National Deworming Day

About:

- This coal mine project has been a source of concern due to its potential environmental impact. Coal mining can release harmful pollutants into the air and water, and can also contribute to climate change.
- The project has also been criticized for its potential displacement of local communities.
- National Deworming Day (NDD) is observed annually on February 10th in India
- It aims to make every child in the country "worm-free."
- It was launched in 2015, and the initiative targets children aged 1-19 years, both enrolled and non-enrolled in schools. through platforms like schools Anganwadi centers.
- Theme of National Deworming Day 2024 is "Eliminate STH: Invest in a healthier future for children"
- It revolves around public health, with a specific focus on preventing and controlling parasitic worm infections, particularly in children

Significance:

Reduces worm infections:

Soil-transmitted helminths (intestinal worms) are prevalent in India, leading to health issues like anemia, malnutrition, cognitive development, impaired reduced school attendance. NDD tackles this by mass deworming children.

Improves overall health:

By eliminating worms. **NDD** improves children's overall health, nutritional status. and quality of life, contributing to better educational outcomes and future potential.

World Pulses Day

- In 2018, the United Nations General Assembly declared February 10 as World Pulses Day.
- This day was established to emphasize the importance of pulses in mitigating global food challenges, improving human health, and improving soil health.
- This includes dry edible seeds like lentils. chickpeas, beans, and dry peas.
- The theme for World Pulses Day 2024 is 'Pulses: Nourishing soil and people.'





This theme emphasizes the positive impact of pulses on both soil health and human nutrition.

Did you Know?

- Burkina Faso proposed the observance of World Pulses Day.
- The Year 2016 was declared as the International Year of Pulses.

India is the largest producer of pulses in the world.

Move to eradicate bonded labour in Katkari community

The Maharashtra State Human Rights Commission has moved to eradicate bonded labour prevalent among members of the Katkari community, which is under the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTG) category.

About:

- The Katkari community is an Adivasi (indigenous) group in Maharashtra, facing a severe issue of bonded labor, also known as "vethbigari."
- This system traps families in debt-based servitude, often lasting generations.
- Despite its illegality since 1976, various factors contribute to its persistence.

Challenges:

- **Deep-rooted Social Structures**
- Illiteracy and Lack of Awareness
- Livelihood Insecurity
- Inadequate Law Enforcement

Govt approves new alignment of Shaktipeet **Mahamarq**

- MH State govt approved the alignment of the Maharashtra Shakti Peeth Mahamarg, the greenfield expressway to connect Nagpur and Goa.
- The 802-km-long expressway will pass through 12 districts.
- Once completed, it will be the longest expressway in the state.
- The Maharashtra State Road Development Corporation (MSRDC) will execute the project.

National Productivity Day

- National Productivity Day is celebrated in India every year on February 12th.
- It marks the foundation day of the National Productivity Council (NPC), an autonomous organization established in 1958 to promote productivity consciousness and culture in the country.
- The day is recognized as part of a week-long National Productivity Week, observed from February 12th to 18th.
- This year's theme is "Artificial Intelligence (AI)- Productivity Engine for Economic Growth."
- It highlights the crucial role of AI in driving a country's economic growth and productivity.

About:

- This date marks the anniversary of the foundation of the International Labour Organization (ILO).
- The first NPD was celebrated in 1962.

People lose Rs 3 crore to cybercrime across Maharashtra daily'

- Cybercrime has become a major concern in Maharashtra, with citizens losing a staggering Rs 3 crore every day.
- This translates to approximately Rs 1.095 billion annually, highlighting the vast impact of these illegal activities.
- National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) data revealed that Maharashtra saw 8,249 cybercrime cases in 2022, which was 48% higher than 5,562 incidents recorded in the previous year.
- Barely Rs 134 crore or 10% of the total Rs 1,300 crore lost to cybercrime in Maharashtra since 2019 have been recovered

- The types of cybercrime reported in the state include:
- Financial Frauds: Phishing scams, online investment frauds, mobile wallet thefts, etc.
- Data Breaches: Unauthorized access to personal or financial information.
- Malware Attacks: Viruses, ransomware, spyware, etc.





Marathwada agricultural university develops seven new crop varieties

- The Parbhani-based Vasantrao Naik Marathwada Agricultural University has developed seven new varieties of crops.
- The new varieties include five field crops and two vegetable crops.

Five Field Crops include:

- 1. American cotton non-Bt variety NH 677
- 2. Chickpea variety called Parbhani Chana-16
- 3. Soybean variety MAUS 731
- 4. Sorghum variety, Parbhani Shakti (PVK 1009)
- 5. Trombay Latur til TLT 10

Two vegetable varieties are:

- 1. A new variety of chili
- 2. Tomato (PBNT 20)

ASI to conserve 7 Maratha military forts across state

- Additional director general of ASI said that this year the focus of ASI will be on maintaining and conserving the forts located in Maharashtra
- The statement followed the nomination of seven Maratha military forts under its jurisdiction in Maharashtra for the Unesco world heritage tag for the years 2024–25.
- These were among the 12, 17th-century forts marked as the Maratha military landscapes for the nomination this year.
- From Maharashtra, Shivneri, Lohagad, Raigad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala, Vijaydurg, and Sindhudurg forts are nominated.

International Day of Women and Girls in Science

- The International Day of Women and Girls in Science (IDWGS), celebrated annually on February 11th
- It aims to recognize the critical role women and girls play in science and technology, and promote their full and equal access and participation in these fields.
- This year's theme, "Closing the Gender Gap in Science: Accelerating Action", underscores the urgent need to address the

barriers that hinder women and girls from pursuing and thriving in STEM careers

About:

 On 22 December 2015, the General Assembly decided to establish an annual International Day to recognize the critical role women and girls play in science and technology, through Resolution A/RES/70/212.

Jalyukta Shivar scheme to cover 24,000 villages in state

 State govt aims to target more than 24,000 villages in Maharashtra for recharging groundwater levels and saving water under the Jalyukta Shivar 2.0 scheme.

About:

- Govt initiated Jalyukta Shivar 2.0 in 2022 to carry out works on accumulating water so that it can make water available for drinking and agriculture purposes to local residents.
- During the first phase of the scheme, the government had taken water conservation measures across 22,000 villages in the state, which saved water equal to 1.5 TMC.

₹4,000cr approved for climate resilient project in Maharashtra

The state irrigation department and CM-led Maharashtra Institution for Transformation (MITRA) has proposed Maharashtra Climate Resilient Development Project (MCRDP)

About:

- It aims to address the concerns related to the floods in Kolhapur and Sangli district and the plan to divert flood waters to droughtprone areas of the state.
- The World Bank has approved Rs4,000 crore for MCRDP, of which 30% of funds have to be shared by the state government.

MAFSU's proposed Wildlife One Health Centre to be first in India

- The Maharashtra Animal and Fisheries Sciences University (MAFSU), Nagpur, has submitted a proposal for Wildlife One Health Centre to the state govt.
- It will be the extension of the present Wildlife Research and Training Centre (WRTC) at Gorewada.





This ₹30 crore project would be the only institution dedicated to Wildlife Health in the country.

National Women's Day in India

- In India, Sarojini Naidu's birth anniversary, on February 13, is marked as National Women's Day in honour of a woman who represented the spirit of female **empowerment** throughout her life and championed equality.
- She was a prominent freedom fighter and poet known as the "Nightingale of India".

- 1. Recognize the significant contributions of women in various fields
- 2. Highlight their crucial role in shaping the nation's progress
- 3. Raise awareness about persisting gender disparities and challenges faced by women in India

World Radio Day

- February 13th, 2024, marks the 12th Annual World Radio Day, established by UNESCO
- The theme for World Radio Day 2024 is 'Radio: A century informing, entertaining and educating.
- This year's celebration reflects on the past 100 years of radio's remarkable journey, its present relevance, and its promising future.

About:

- In 2011, the member states of the United **Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural** Organization (UNESCO) declared February 13 World Radio Day
- It was then adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 2013 as an international event.
- Radio remains the most widely consumed media platform globally, reaching billions of people, especially in remote areas and those with limited internet access.

MTHL Connection to Mumbai-Pune **Expressway Set to Commence Soon**

- The construction of a crucial connector linking the Mumbai Trans-Harbour Link (MTHL) with the Mumbai-Pune Expressway is about to begin.
- The estimated cost of project is ₹1,000 crore

This project promises to revolutionize travel between Mumbai and Pune, offering several benefits:

Reduced Travel Time:

Bypassing congested areas like Sion-Panvel Highway and Vashi toll plaza, the connection aims to cut travel time between south Mumbai and Pune by about an hour.

Enhanced Connectivity:

- The project involves two six-lane elevated roads, one connecting Chirle-Gavhan Phata and the other linking Palaspe to the Mumbai-Pune Expressway.
- This creates a seamless connection between Mumbai and Navi Mumbai, further boosted by future plans to connect MTHL with Worli.

Tiger Safari at Sanjay Gandhi National Park Roars Back After Renovations

- The Sanjay Gandhi National Park (SGNP), also known as Borivali National Park, in Mumbai, has witnessed a surge in visitors to its tiger safari since its reopening after renovations in early 2024.
- The park has experienced a significant increase in visitors, with approximately 5,000 people visiting the national park daily and an average of 3,000 people participating in the safari activity each day
- The park now boasts revamped enclosures, improved infrastructure, and enhanced safety measures, providing tourists with a thrilling and informative experience while ensuring the well-being of the majestic tigers.

Shil Phata flyover to reduce travel time between city, Mum & Pune

- Shil Phata Flyover, officially known as the ShilPhata Junction Flyover, aims to significantly reduce travel time between Thane, Mumbai, and Pune.
- Located on National Highway 48 (NH-48) in Kalyan, Maharashtra, this flyover addresses a notorious traffic bottleneck known for congestion and delays.

Key Features:

Dual carriageway: Each arm has three lanes, one for Panyel-bound traffic and the other for Thane-bound traffic.





- Length and width: 739.5 meters long and 24 meters wide, with a 300-meter viaduct.
- Cost: Approximately Rs 45.68 crore.

- This proactive move aimed to prevent potential scarcity and price fluctuations ahead of the Lok Sabha elections.


Kev concerns of farmers:

State to build 7.000km of roads

- A decision to build another 7,000 km of roads and bridges under CM's Gram Sadak Yojana was taken in the state cabinet meeting.
- Phase-II of CM's Gram Sadak Yojana aims to have 10.000 km of roads.
- It has been decided in which districts to build 7.000 km of new roads.





Water level in dams falls to 50%

- Water levels in dams falling to 50% can be a cause for concern, indicating potential water scarcity.
- The severity of the situation depends on various factors, including:
- Different regions have varying water needs and rainfall patterns.
- A 50% level in a drought-prone area might be more critical than in a region with regular rainfall.
- Dams serve various purposes, including water supply. irrigation, hydropower generation, and flood control.
- A low level for a drinking water reservoir is more alarming than for a flood control dam.

About:

- Maharashtra has 2,994 small, medium and major dams with a total live storage capacity of 40.485 million cubic meters.
- The total stock in these dams in mid-February was 20,472.63 million cubic meters, or 50.57% of the capacity, 18% lower than last vear's water level of 68.37%.
- Most dams in the state did not have adequate inflow in 2023 owing to dry spells during the monsoon.

Hi-tech mega projects to be declared thrust sector, get incentives

- The state cabinet in MH has declared hitech mega projects as a thrust sector to promote development backward in regions.
- Incentives include stamp duty waiver, power duty waiver, and power bill reduction.
- The cabinet has also approved incentives for integrated industrial areas, including a stamp duty waiver on lease rent.

6 new nursing colleges approved by the cabinet in Maharashtra

- In a Cabinet meeting held, a decision was taken to establish six government nursing colleges with an admission capacity of 100 students each.
- These colleges will be affiliated with Government Medical Colleges in Jalgaon, Latur, Baramati, Sangli (Miraj), Nandurbar, and Gondia.

CM Eknath Shinde chaired the meeting and stated that considering the prevalence of infectious diseases in the state and the country, the government is making significant changes to the paramedical curriculum.

MTDC to give 50% off for Women's Day

- On the occasion of International Women's Maharashtra **Tourism** Dav. the Development Corporation (MTDC) has decided to give a 50% discount to women tourists if they reserve their accommodation in MTDC hotels in online mode.
- Additionally, the MTDC will be providing new accommodation amenities for tourists at various Navegaon Bandh in Gondia district. Naleshwar near Kolara Gate of Tadoba Sanctuary in Chandrapur district, Sahastrakund and Tipeshwar in Yavatmal.

Nagpur to host national bridge meet after 28 yrs

- Nagpur, the "Tiger Capital of India," is set to bridge the gap of 28 years by hosting the prestigious National Bridge Championship in 2024.
- This event marks a **significant return for the** city, which last held the tournament in 1996.

About:

- Anil Padhye, who won a silver medal for India at the World Bridge Championships in Italy in 2022, says the game supports development of the brain and is especially found to help children get comfortable with mathematics.
- He will also take part in the Dr NP Tolani Centennial Celebrations All India Tolani Open National Masters Bridge Championship

Maharashtra amends rule, pvt schools may go out of RTE quota ambit

- Private unaided schools in Maharashtra. mostly English mediums, have been fighting with the state government for reimbursement of their 25% RTE quota admissions fees.
- The government has amended the education rules, exempting schools near government or aided institutions from participating in RTE admissions, which raises concerns





about the future of RTE admissions and the effectiveness of state schemes.

Summer onion plantation declines by 40% in Nashik

- The summer onion plantation in four districts of north Maharashtra, including Nashik, Dhule, Jalgaon, and Nandurbar, has decreased by 40% due to less rain.
- The production is estimated to decline to 35 lakh tonnes.
- In the 2022-23 season, the summer onion plantation in Nashik district was 2.21 lakh hectares.

Maharashtra reports lower than expected farm finance

- State Level Banking Conference (SLBC), the apex body of bankers in the state, reported lower than expected farm credit reaching
- Banks were given a target of Rs 1,68,481 crores to be disbursed as loan for agriculture for the 2023-24 fiscal.
- But till September 2023, only Rs 88,881 crores was disbursed, which roughly estimates to 53 per cent of the target.
- Thus, only 53% of its targeted farm credit for 2023-24 as of September 2023
- This represents a decrease from 57% achieved in the previous year.
- In contrast, loan disbursal to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) reached 68% of the target, exceeding the previous year's 62%.

Maharashtra Water Crisis

- Maharashtra is facing a severe water crisis, with many reservoirs shrinking to critical levels in February 2024.
- This has raised concerns about water shortages for drinking, irrigation, and industrial use.

About:

- Most of the dams in the state have reached the bottom, with an average of 21.61 percent less water stock left than last year.
- The state's 12 projects are currently in minus storage, with 15 dams having barely 10 percent storage.
- The situation in Marathwada is alarming. Marathwada has only 26 percent water stock left. Last year, it was 72 percent.
- The storage in 138 major dams in the state has come down to 50.37 percent from 74.34 percent last year.

Nashik stands 3rd in Maha dist good governance index

- The Nashik district stood third in the recent District Good Governance Index (DGGI) of encompasses Maharashtra that governance sectors with 161 indicators and over 300 data points.
- It is the first time that the department of administrative reforms and organization and methods carried out such an exercise.
- Maharashtra has become the fifth state in the country to implement such an exercise.

- Maharashtra has emerged as the top recipient of foreign direct investment (FDI) in the country

- The number of new leprosy patients is increasing inspite of the efforts made by the health department to eradicate leprosy at various levels.
- In the past three years, the number of leprosy patients has been continuously increasing in this research campaign and Health Minister Tanaii Sawant has decided to provide nutritional food to these leprosy patients during treatment.
- Rs 500 nutritional food will be given to leprosy patients.

About:

- According to the information available from the Department of Health (Leprosy and Tuberculosis), 14,520 leprosy patients were detected in 2021-22. In 2022-23, this increased to 19,860 leprosy patients and in the search campaign till December 2023-24, 20 thousand leprosy patients were found.
- The proportion of newly diagnosed patients is 9.55 percent, 11.14 percent and 15.58 percent respectively.

- Even more concerning, the fiscal deficit crossed the Rs 1 lakh crore mark for the first time, reaching Rs 1.11 lakh crore.
