India's 100 Richest 2022: Gautam Adani tops Forbes rich list

India's 100 Richest 2022:

The world economy may be slowing but India's richest have grown even richer this year. The **Forbes 2022 list of India's 100 richest** is finally here, according to which, the combined wealth of India's 100 richest grew by \$25 billion to touch a colossal \$800 billion. The top 10 richest Indians are worth a cumulative \$385 billion. **Adani Group chairman Gautam Adani** has bagged the top spot on the list with a net worth of \$150 billion. According to Forbes, the gain was largely due to a record-breaking feat by infrastructure tycoon, which changed the pecking order at the top for the first time since 2008.

New Faces on India's 100 richest list:

3

- **Falguni Nayar:** With a net worth of \$4.8 billion, as per the Forbes data, Nayar is on the 44th spot in the list.
- **Rekha Jhunjhunwala:** The wife of Rakesh Jhunjhunwala, who is fondly remembered as India's very own Warren Buffet. At the 30th spot, Rekha Jhunjhunwala, 59, has replaced her husband on the list. She has a net worth of \$5.9 billion.
- **Nehal Vakil:** The representative of the third generation of the Vakil family that is running Asian Paints, which was founded in 1942. The family's total worth is \$.52 billion.
- **Venu Srinivasan:** The founder of the TVS group, one of the largest two-wheeler manufacturers in the world, is also a new entrant on the list this year. He is also the recipient of Padma Bhushan, the third-highest civilian award in the country.
- **Ravi Modi:** The owner of Vedant Fashions, named after his only son. The manufacturer of Indian ethnic wear known for the Manyawar brand went public in 2022. His total worth is about \$3.6 billion.

• Nirmal Minda: The Chairman and MD of UNO Minda (formerly Minda Industries), has the net worth of \$2600 crore.

• **Rafique Malik:** Having listed Metro Brands last December, Rafique Malik figures on No. 89 with \$2.22 billion. The privately held company is known for its brands such as Mochi, Metro and Walkway.

The returnees on India's 100 richest list:

- Among the four returnees on the list is Anand Mahindra with a net worth of \$2.2 billion or Rs 17,768.08 crore. Bhadresh Shah (Rs 15,345.16 crore), Anu Aga (Rs 18,010.37 crore) and Joy Alukkas (Rs 25,036.84 crore) are also among the returnees on the rich list.
- Paytm CEO Vijay Shekhar Sharma was a notable name among the drop-offs, who saw shares of his One97 Communications tank amid the global tech rout. The cutoff for the top 100 was \$1.9 billion this year.

Vijay Hazare Trophy Final: Saurashtra beat Maharashtra by 5 wickets

Vijay Hazare Trophy Final

Saurashtra beat **Maharashtra** by 5 wickets in the final to win the **Vijay Hazare Trophy** at the Narendra Modi Stadium in **Ahmedabad**, **Gujarat**. They restricted Maharashtra at 248/9 in 50 overs as captain **Ruturaj Gaikwad** hit a century, scoring 108 off 131 balls after a slow start. Saurashtra bowler Chirag Jani claimed a hat-trick in the match. Man of the moment is Sheldon Jackson.

Chasing the target of 249, Saurashtra started off cautiously before the openers sitiched a 125-run partnership. Batter Shledon Jackson held one end as wickets tumbled around him. He scored a match-winning 133 off 136 balls to help Saurashtra chase down the target in 46.3 overs, with five wickets to spare. It was Saurashtra's second title triumph in history.

Notably: The win enhanced Jaydev Unadkat's credentials as captain, he had led Saurashtra to their first Ranji Trophy title in 2019-2020. He also finished at the top of the wicket-taking charts in the Vijay Hazare Trophy with 19 strikes to his name.

Reserve Bank of India implements 4 tiered regulatory norms for UCB

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced a fourtiered regulatory framework for categorisation of Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs). Besides, the central bank has come out with norms pertaining to the net worth and capital adequacy of these banks.

The Reserve Bank of India had constituted the Expert Committee on Urban Co-operative Banks, under the Chairmanship of **Shri N. S. Vishwanathan**, former Deputy Governor, Reserve Bank to examine the issues in urban cooperative banking sector and to review regulatory/ supervisory approach for strengthening the sector. Based on the recommendations of the Expert Committee, RBI had released the Revised Regulatory Framework for Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs) on July 19, 2022. The four-tiered regulatory framework, based on size of deposits of the UCBs, will come into force with immediate effect.

RBI has now categorized Urban Co-Operative Banks in India into four tier depending upon the deposit with the bank:

- Tier 1: UCB are those banks having deposits up to **Rs 100** crore operating in a single district or having branches in contiguous districts.
- Tier 2: UCBs with deposits more than **Rs.100 crore and up to Rs.1000 crore.**
- Tier 3 UCBs with deposits more than **Rs.1000 crore** and up to **Rs.10,000 crore**.
- Tier 4 UCBs with deposits more than **Rs.10, 000 crore.**

Minimum Net worth Requirement of the banks

• The minimum net worth (have a minimum capital and reserves) requirement for the Tier 1 UCBs operating in single districts shall be Rs 2 crore.

For other UCB it shall be Rs 5 crore.

• Those UCBs which do not meet the requirement, have to achieve the minimum net worth of ₹2 crore or ₹5 crore in a phased manner in five years. The banks will have to achieve the 50% minimum net worth requirement in three years and the remaining 50% in next two years.

What is Urban Cooperative Banks?

Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs) are registered as cooperative societies under the provisions of, either the State Cooperative Societies Act of the State concerned under the provisions of the or the **Multi State Cooperative Societies Act, 2002.** There is a duality of control over the UCB. It is regulated by the **Registrar of Cooperatives and also by the RBI.** UCB registered under the State Cooperative Societies Act are regulated and supervised by the Registrar of Cooperative Societies (RCS) of the State concerned. UCB which are set up under the Multi State Cooperative Societies Act, 2002 are regulated by the **Central Registrar of Cooperative Societies (CRCS).**

Regulation of banking function

The Banking Regulation Act 1949 was made applicable on these banks from 1 March 1966. The Reserve Bank regulates and supervises the banking functions of UCBs under the provisions of **Banking Regulation Act, 1949**.

Earthshot Prize 2022

Earthshot prize 2022:

India's Greenhouse-in-a-box was among the five winners announced by the Prince of Wales, Prince William, in Boston, United States. It is a sustainable solution for small-scale farmers developed by an Indian startup, Kheyti, in Telangana which has won one million pounds (\$1.2 million). Co-founder and CEO of Kheyti, Kaushik Kappagantulu, said that he had launched the solution for at least 100 million local smallholder farmers who are most impacted by climate change. The aim of greenhouse-in-a-box is to reduce costs and increase yields which in turn would help protect the livelihoods of these farmers.

About the Earthshot prize:

Founded by Prince William this was the second edition of the Earthshot prize which has also been dubbed the 'Eco Oscars' and witnessed the presence of several celebrities who walked the green carpet. Kheyti won the prize in the Protect and Restore Nature category which saw hundreds of entries from across the world.

All 15 finalists will receive support from the Earthshot Prize Global Alliance which is a network of NGOs and private sector businesses around the world which will assist in scaling these solutions. The other five winners are from Kenya, the United Kingdom, Australia and Oman.

RBI Monetary Policy 2022: RBI Repo Rate Hike by 35 bps to 6.25%

RBI Monetary Policy 2022:

The decision of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor **Shaktikanta Das** headed six-member Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has been announced. In the consecutive fifth hike this year, the RBI's Monetary Policy Committee has raised the repo rate by **35 basis points (bps) to 6.25 per cent** with immediate effect, making loans expensive. The policy rate is now at the highest level since August 2018. The RBI has maintained policy stance at **'withdrawal of accommodation'**.

RBI Repo Rate: Consequently, the various rates are as under

- Policy Repo Rate: 6.25% (Changed)
- Standing Deposit Facility (SDF): 6.00% (Changed)
- Marginal Standing Facility Rate: 6.50% (Changed)
- Bank Rate: 6.50% (Changed)
- Fixed Reverse Repo Rate: 3.35%
- Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR): 4.50%
- Statutory Liquidity Ratio (SLR): 18.00%

Key Points of the Monetary Policy:

- RBI has maintained consumer price index (CPI) inflation forecast for FY23 at **6.7%**. Real FY23 GDP forecast lowered to **6.8% from 7%**.
- Inflation expected to be above **4% in the next 12** months.
- Standing Deposit Facility rate, Marginal Standing Facility rate also increased by 35 basis points each to 6% and 6.5%
- India's retail inflation fell to a three-month low of **6.77%** in October, down from 7.41% in September. However, remained above the RBI's tolerance band for the 10th consecutive row.
- Equities open flat with a negative bias as Sensex dips over 55 points, Nifty falls 0.2% ahead of RBI's policy decision.
- Liquidity conditions are set to improve. Weighted average lending rate is up 117 bps in May-October.

The Monetary Policy Committee

Section 45ZB of the amended RBI Act, 1934 provides for an empowered six-member **monetary policy** committee (MPC) to be constituted by the Central Government by notification in the Official Gazette. The first such MPC was constituted on September 29, 2016. The present MPC members, as notified by the Central Government in the Official Gazette of October 5, 2020, are as under:

- 1. Governor of the Reserve Bank of India—Chairperson, ex officio;
- 2. Deputy Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, in charge of Monetary Policy—Member, ex officio;
- 3. One officer of the Reserve Bank of India to be nominated by the Central Board—Member, ex officio;
- 4. **Prof. Ashima Goyal,** Professor, Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research Member;

- 5. **Prof. Jayanth R. Varma**, Professor, Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad—Member; and
- Dr. Shashanka Bhide, Senior Advisor, National Council of Applied Economic Research, Delhi—Member. (Members referred to at 4 to 6 above, will hold office for a period of four years or until further orders, whichever is earlier)

What is the role of MPC?

- The MPC determines the policy repo rate required to achieve the inflation target.
- The MPC is required to meet at least four times in a year. The quorum for the meeting of the MPC is four members.
- Each member of the MPC has one vote, and in the event of an equality of votes, the Governor has a second or casting vote.
- Each Member of the Monetary Policy Committee writes a statement specifying the reasons for voting in favour of, or against the proposed resolution.

United Nations: "Diwali Stamp-Power of One" awarded to four veteran diplomats and a US lawmaker

Diwali Stamp-Power of One Awards:

Four veteran diplomats and a US lawmaker have been honoured with this year's annual 'Diwali- Power of One' award here for their efforts in working towards a peaceful and secure world. The award, which is also known as the 'Oscars of Diplomacy', is presented to former top diplomats of the United Nations or a member state for their effort to help form a more perfect, peaceful and secure world for all."

The 2022 award ceremony was co-organised by **Diwali** Foundation USA and the Delegation of the European Union to the United Nations, and the Permanent Missions of Chile, Georgia, India, Kazakhstan, Kiribati, Morocco, Oman and Sri Lanka to the United Nations. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the awards were suspended in 2020 and 2021.

Notably: Previous honourees of the award include former Deputy Executive Director of UN Women **Lakshmi Puri**, former UK Ambassador to the UN **Matthew Rycroft**, Ukraine's former UN envoy **Yuriy Sergeyev** and Vietnam's former Permanent Representative to the UN **Nguyen Phuong Ngai**.

Was established in 2017 to promote a peaceful and consensus-based process to achieve societal 'Good', as befits the high hopes and ideals of humanity enshrined in the United Nations Charter. The Foundation established the "Diwali Stamp – The Power of One" Award to celebrate and highlight the important work done in a peaceful manner, especially at the United Nations.

BBC Releases 100 Most Influential Women's List: 4 Indian women's in the list

BBC Releases 100 Most Influential Women's List:

The British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) has published the list of 100 most influential women in the world and has included women from several areas such as politics, science, sports, entertainment, and literature. The BBC's 100 most influential women's list also includes four Indians: Actress Priyanka Chopra Jonas, author Geetanjali Shree, engineer and astronaut Sirisha Bandla, and social worker Sneha Jawale.

The annual list celebrates the achievements of women internationally, from grassroots volunteers to global leaders, and is used by BBC to focus on women's experiences around the world through a dedicated series of interviews, documentaries and features. For the first time this year, the BBC asked some of the previous '100 Women' to nominate women they feel deserve a place on the 2022 list.

Time Magazine's 2022 Person of the Year: Volodymyr Zelensky and "Spirit of Ukraine"

Time magazine named President **Volodymyr Zelensky** as well as **"the spirit of Ukraine"** as its 2022 person of the year, for the resistance the country has shown in the face of Russia's invasion. Zelensky shares the 2022 title with "the spirit of Ukraine," which Felsenthal said was embodied by the "countless individuals inside and outside the country" who fought behind the scenes, including everyday people such as chefs and surgeons.

The Time magazine editor **Edward Felsenthal** wrote that "spirit of Ukraine" referred to Ukrainians around the world, including many who "fought behind the scenes" against the Russian invasion. The magazine said Mr Zelensky had inspired Ukrainians and was recognised internationally for his courage in resisting the Russian invasion.

Other categories winners:

- **Time Heroes of the Year:** Women in Iran were named the **Time Heroes of the Year.** Iranian women who are protesting for over three months against the custodial death of 22-year-old **Mahsa Amini.** She was arrested for not wearing hijab publicly and she died while in the custody of the Iranian morality police. Her death has triggered a mass protest from the Iranian women against public wearing of Hijab and the morality police.
- **Time's Entertainer of the year:** The South Korean Kpop band **Blackpink** were recognised as.
- Athlete of the Year: American baseball player Aaron Judge.
- Icon of the Year: Malaysian actress Michelle Yeoh .

Named the Indian who featured time person of the Year:

- Mahatma Gandhi is the only Indian to be named TIME Person of the Year, having been given the honour in 1930. The magazine described him as 'Saint Gandhi' and later named him as one of the 25 Political Icons of all time.
- The tradition of naming Time person of the year started in 1927. Initially it was named the Time Man of the Year. Other past winners have included the former dictator of Germany, Adolf Hitler in 1938, and Russian President Vladimir Putin, who was 2007's Person of the Year.
- Time first presented its Person of the Year award in 1927. Last year's honoree was Tesla and **SpaceX chief Elon Musk**, who has since made major headlines with his high-profile purchase of Twitter.

IPL remains the most searched query on Google in India on 2022

Google has released its **"Year in Search 2022" report,** which highlights the topics that generated the most interest and were most frequently searched on the website this year. India's search trends have changed noticeably since last year, according to the list, which is published annually for various nations.

Year in Search 2022: Key points

- The Indian Premier League (IPL), which was also the most searched sporting event in the nation, came out on top of all 2022 trending search results in India.
- **CoWIN,** a government website portal that streamlines COVID-19 vaccine registration and appointment scheduling and issues digital vaccine certificates, followed IPL.
- The FIFA World Cup, which began on November 20 in Qatar, ranked third among trending topics in searches in India. Sports competitions, the Asia Cup and the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, respectively, took the fourth and fifth spots.
- Bollywood blockbuster **Brahmastra: Part One Shiva** earned the sixth spot on the list, while **KGF: Chapter 2** came in at number nine.
- **Nupur Sharma,** a spokesperson for the BJP who has since been suspended, was among the top-searched individuals in India in 2022.
- **Droupadi Murmu**, the president of India, was subsequently followed by **Rishi Sunak**, the new prime minister of the **United Kingdom**, and Lalit Modi.
- In terms of news events, Google headlined that the demise of Lata Mangeshkar, Sidhu Moose Wala, Queen Elizabeth and Shane Warne were the most searched topics.
- People also took interest in the **Russia-Ukraine war, UP Elections, and Har Ghar Tiranga campaign**.
- Depicting a logical transition in annual trends, the most popular "near me" searches were for "movies near me," "water parks near me," swimming pools near me," and other travel and outing-related terms. In contrast, searches for "COVID test near me," "Oxygen cylinder near me," and "COVID hospital near me" were made last year.

FIFA World Cup 2022 concludes

FIFA World Cup 2022:

FIFA World Cup 2022: Messi's Argentina clinched their **3rd World Cup trophy** from six final appearances in history, seeing off France 4–2 on penalties (3–3 after extra time) to win the biggest prize in men's football. It had won two in **1978 and 1986 under Diego Maradona.** Lionel Messi had come close to winning in 2014 but La Albiceleste lost the final 0-1 to Germany. The only similarity from Messi's 2014 campaign in Qatar was his Golden Ball award for Player of the Tournament award. He became the first player to win two World Cup Golden Balls.

Notably: The **22nd edition** of the World Cup just ended and for another 4 years for the next World Cup. Also, The 2026 World Cup will be held across three different countries, **the United States, Canada and Mexico.**

Hurun Global 500 rankings: India ranked 5th in the list of valuable companies

2022 Hurun Global 500 list

India, with 20 of the most valuable companies in the world, has moved into the **fifth position** among countries that are home to the world's top 500 firms. Last year, it ranked ninth with eight companies. The US continued to top the charts, according to the 2022 Hurun Global 500 list. The list, released by the **Hurun Research Institute**, is a compilation of the 500 most valuable non-state-controlled companies in the world. Companies were ranked according to their market capitalisation (for listed companies) and valuations for nonlisted companies.

Key points in the ranking:

- Of the 20 Indian companies featuring on the list this • year, 11 are based in Mumbai, four in Ahmedabad and one each in Noida, New Delhi, Bengaluru and Kolkata.
- With a \$202-billion valuation, Reliance Industries • (RIL) topped the charts of Indian companies, while it ranked 34th in the world. It was followed by Tata **Consultancy Services (\$139 billion) and HDFC Bank** (\$97 billion).
- The list also saw the entry of four companies Adani Transmission, Adani Green Energy, Adani Enterprises and Adani Total Gas — led by billionaire Gautam Adani, with a total valuation of \$173 billion.
- The other new entrants in the list from India include ITC (\$52 billion), Avenue Supermarts (\$33 billion), Axis Bank (\$33 billion), Bajaj Finserv (\$32 billion) and Larson & Toubro (\$32 billion).
- Interestingly, 50 per cent or 250 companies in the Hurun Global 500 companies have presence in India.

Tops global charts:

Globally, **Apple** retained the title of the most valuable company in the world with a market cap of \$2.4 trillion and Microsoft came second (\$1.8 trillion), while Alphabet, the parent company of Google, displaced **Amazon** to take the third place.

China came in second with 35 companies, followed by Japan (28) and the UK (21). India and Canada moved up to the fifth place with 20 companies each, adding eight and three companies, respectively, overtaking France and Germany.

Buttler, who is one of the destructive batters in white-ball cricket in the world, beat Adil Rashid and Shaheen Shah Afridi to win the ICC Player of the Month award for his brilliant performance in the crunch semi-final match against India and leading England to their first T20 World Cup title since 2010.

England opener smashed 73 from 47 balls against New Zealand, and then 80 from 49 balls, as well stitched unbeaten 170-run partnership with Alex Hales during England's victory in the semi-final against India before making a valuable 26 in the final against Pakistan to guide the side to T20 World Cup title.

ICC Women's Player of the month award for November: Sidra Ameen

Sidra Ameen beat Ireland's Gaby Lewis and Thailand's Natthakan Chantam to win the ICC Women's Player of the Month for her outstanding performance against Ireland in the ODI series, where she amassed 277 runs in three matches at home. She became the second Pakistani cricketer after Mohammad Rizwan (September) to win this award.

The overall number of GI has reached 432, according to a statement made on Wednesday by the ministry of business and industry.

GI tags from Assam: Key Points

- Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, and Kerala are the top five states with the greatest number of GIs, it was said.
- The government approved spending of Rs 75 crore for three years for GI promotion at awareness programmes, supporting the promotion of GIs.

What is GI tag?

A GI is primarily a produced product (handicrafts and industrial goods), an agricultural product, or a natural product that comes from a specific geographic region. Such a name typically carries a guarantee of quality and originality, which is mostly attributed to the location of its origin.

How to register for GI tag?

- The correct procedure for registering GI items entails the submission of an application, preliminary examination and scrutiny, show cause notice, publication in the geographical indications journal, opposition to registration, and registration.
- Any group of individuals, producers, organisations, or authorities created by or operating under the law are eligible to apply. The applicant must converse for the interests of the producers.

What are the popular products with GI tags?

The well-known products that have the GI tags include Basmati rice, Darjeeling tea, Chanderi fabric, Mysore silk, Kullu shawl, Kangra tea, Thanjavur paintings, Allahabad surkha, Farrukhabad prints, Lucknow zardozi, and Kashmir walnut wood carving.

- The 27-year-old Sindhu, who won the singles gold and doubles silver at the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham earlier this year, earned \$7 million out of her total earnings of \$7.1 million.
- For the third year in a row, Osaka topped Forbes' annual list of the world's highest-paid female athletes. The list is once again dominated by tennis players.
- Naomi Osaka, the world number 42, topped the list with a total annual earning of \$51.1 million, while Serena Williams is a distant second with \$41.3 million and Eileen Gu, the freestyle skier, third with a total coffer of \$20.1 million.

FIFA officially announced the 2022 world rankings

FIFA (Fédération Internationale de Football Association): FIFA has officially announced the 2022 world rankings, and Brazil hold on to their No. 1 spot and 22nd FIFA Men's World Cup 2022 Champions Argentina ranked 2nd. Morocco has improved from 22nd to 11th in the FIFA world ranking, following their achievements at the 2022 FIFA Global Cup.

Why aren't Argentina top?

Given the way FIFA calculates its rankings, Lionel Messi and Argentina were given points based on the strength of their recent opponents. Brazil have a total points tally of 1840.77, just over two points more than Argentina's 1838.38. That means that Argentina will overtake Brazil after their next game if they win and Brazil fail to win.

Who are the big climbers?

- **Morocco** are the big winners as the Atlas Lions surged up 11 spots to 11th in the world. The job Walid Regragui did was sensational and they were the darlings of the 2022 World Cup.
- **Japan** also moved up four spots to 20th, while the USA and Switzerland each moved up three spots with the Americans ranked 13th in the world and Switzerland in 12th.
- Australia moved up 11 spots to 27th as the Socceroos shocked us all by reaching the last 16 at the World Cup, where they gave eventual champs Argentina a really tough game.
- Cameroon moved up 10 places to 33rd, thanks largely to their famous victory against Brazil in the group stage.


