Many spiritual paths advocate a mental state called detachment, in which a person moves away from worldly concerns and becomes an observer of life. Raja Yoga also teaches 'detachment', but the image used to explain the concept is not that of a dusty-footed pilgrim scaling a mountain, but of a lotus flower.

The main thing about a lotus flower is that it has its roots in the mud. It cannot grow without the mud and yet its petals are pristine. This is detachment which is being close to what you most want to be free of, and using it to make you grow; not separating yourself from anything. Take your own personality: Usually, there are aspects of yourself that either you are unaware of, or you just don't like. Unconsciously, you distort them into something attractive. Hence hard work in a person often denotes fear of disapproval. This is the direct opposite of detachment: doing something, not for its own value, but to enhance your personal position.

The lotus flower doesn't turn mud into anything. Mud is mud. Yet, mud also has nutrients needed to aid the flower's growth. We too are in a situation that we don't like – 'in the mud'. And yet, it is probably the most secure position there - if we could only recognise it, not distort it, and let it 'grow us'.

Alternatively, we want to be free of someone, to be alone, but the relationship has somehow caught hold of us. The person now close to us is probably the best teacher we could have, if we were only able to see the 'nutrient' in their presence; if we could recognise too, that we are probably focusing on a very minor aspect of their personality, and totally disregarding the rest. Detachment is freedom from slants and bias of this kind. It means seeing the whole picture.

The luthiers Andrea Amati and Antonio Stradivari were both from Cremona. Their instruments—along with those of another luthier, Giuseppe Guarneri—have inspired almost every contemporary take on violin design, but the originals are still peerless

In 1751, the renowned Italian violinist Francesco Geminiani took a break from bowing and set pen to paper. He wrote, a great violinist had one job: to achieve "a Tone that shall in a Manner rival the most perfect human Voice." Recent research has shown that the instruments themselves may help players accomplish Geminiani's directive. Not only do great violins sing like humans, but those built by different makers also may remind us of different types of human voices.

The study also found that the wood in old violins had been through a lot. It had been treated with chemicals, possibly to ward off bugs and fungus. It had dried out; and it had vibrated so much from centuries of playing that its very fibers had begun to separate. These centuries of experience, the researchers postulate, helped to give the instruments their particular tone.

The most recent study focused on the sound itself. Researchers had already found sonic similarities between Stradivari notes and particular vowel sounds as sung by humans. The investigation recorded a violinist playing 15 different violins: five made by the Stradivari family, three made by the Amati family, and the rest made by other famous luthiers. They then had 16 choir members, eight male and eight female, sing the same scale eight times, once for each of the following vowel sounds: "had, head, heard, heed, hod, hoed, hud, who'd." When the researchers had all of the recordings, they put them through sonic analysis, seeing how different aspects of the violin and human sounds matched up.

Because the researchers were comparing violin sounds with vowel sounds, they focused largely on formants: particular frequency sets that make up vowel vocalizations. When a person says or sings an "I" sound, for example, different parts of his larynx, pharynx, and oral cavity each produce sounds corresponding to a particular set of frequencies, which come together to make up the vowel. The researchers found that, despite lacking this human vocal architecture, the violins, too, produce 'formants' or each of several prominent bands of frequency that determine the phonetic quality of a vowel. The sonic overlap with the sung vowels were wideranging – while Amati and da Salo violins had formants that resembled those of bass and baritone singers, Stradivari violins' formants were more similar to tenors and altos.

Like the Arthurian knight, Harry is sometimes accompanied by loyal companions who aid and abet him in fulfilling his tasks, although in the end he must usually confront the evil knight alone. Like Arthur, Harry pulls a sword out of an

object (in The Chamber of Secrets). Like Arthur, Harry is fated to marry a girl named Ginevra (a derivation of Guinevere). And like Arthur, Harry is the result of divine and human commingling. Why are our brains six times as large as those of other mammals with bodies of a similar size? The leading hypothesis has been that our brain expansion was driven by social pressures, by the need to cooperate or compete with others. But instead the key factor may have been "ecological" challenges like finding food and lighting fires.

"We were expecting social challenges to be a strong promoter of brain size," says Mauricio González-Forero. He has developed a mathematical model of human brain evolution with his colleague Andy Gardner. Until now, the proposed explanations for our large brains have not been placed on a mathematical footing. Models allow you work out the precise consequences of various hypotheses, which can then be compared with the evidence. "If you don't have a model, you don't know what you are testing."

The model starts with the fact that brains require a lot of energy: the brain is 4 per cent of our body size but uses 20 per cent of our energy. The model also assumes that bigger brains help animals get more energy. Human-sized brains and bodies evolved when the challenges individuals faced were 60 per cent ecological, 30 per cent cooperative and 10 per cent between-group competitive, the model predicts. Several factors underlie this. In particular, while environmental challenges do not change as brains get bigger, social challenges do. For instance, working out when you are being cheated might get harder when those around you get smarter. According to the model, this means between-individual or betweengroup competition can sometimes decrease brain size. Essentially, the energy costs of trying to stay ahead in this arms race can outweigh the benefits.

While ecological challenges can favor bigger brains, crucially the model suggests they only do so in situations when every little increase in brainpower helps deliver a somewhat bigger reward. For instance, once an animal is smart enough to crack nuts, getting smarter might not help it get any more nuts, so there would be no continuing pressure favoring a bigger brain. But if, say, every improvement in making and using weapons helps hunters catch more food, that can lead to ever bigger brains. This means human culture might have played a crucial role, by allowing young individuals to continue gaining skills by learning from others. In other words, in animals with advanced cultures, the same environmental pressures can have a very different evolutionary effect on brain size.

David Geary of the University of Missouri in Columbia thinks the model is too simple to fully capture the complexities of social living. "The conclusion that human brain evolution was largely driven by ecological pressures, and only minimally by social pressures, is surprising and likely premature."

The word for an ancient water clock sounds like a name of a Greek goddess: *Clepsydra*. These age-old time-keeping devices are handsome and intriguing, using the gradual flow of water to measure time. Water clocks date back as far as 500 BC and served as a practical daily tool all over the world for well over a millennium.

In ancient Persia, the water clock was a bowl placed in a large pot filled with water. A small hole would be made in the bottom of the bowl so that water from the pot would slowly flow in; when the bowl became full, it would sink down into the pot, and a trusty time keeper would dump it out and place it back on top of the water inside the pot. Time was thus measured by how many times the bowl sank—a bit like an hourglass with the sand swapped out for water. This bowl-pot tag team is one of the oldest time-measuring technologies, with evidence of use by Babylonians, Egyptians, and Native Americans, among others.

The water clock, or fenjaan, was employed in Persia to ensure fair irrigation practices. Due to the arid environment, farmers there built underground irrigation channels that carried water from aquifers to separate properties. In Persia, this system was called *qanat*, but it also existed elsewhere, including China's modern-day Xinjiang Province, where you can still visit the *qanat* (in Uighur, *karez*) in the city of Turpan. Two trusted older men from the village were chosen as full-time clock managers. They were known as khaneh fenjaan and tasked with monitoring water flow day and night. There also existed an even simpler form of outflow clepsydra, known for its use in timing speeches in ancient Rome. This water clock was basically a graduated cylinder with a hole, the passage of time measured by keeping track of the level of remaining water. It could be filled halfway for short speeches and topped off for longer ones, and if a speech or hearing required suspension, the hole could be temporarily plugged with wax. Later and more complicated forms of clepsydra incorporated mechanisms involving gears and wheels, and *clepsydras* remained in wide use until pendulum clocks made their debut in the 17th century. But, should you ever find yourself stranded in the woods sans modern technology and trying to hold an election, you can fashion a fenjaan to keep candidates' speeches in check.

It is important to systematically map which factors do and do not contribute to science scepticism and science (dis)trust in order to provide more precise explanations for why a growing number of individuals reject the notion of anthropogenic climate change, or fear that eating genetically modified products is dangerous, or believe that vaccines cause autism.

Political ideology is seen by many researchers as the main culprit of science scepticism. They have shown that political conservatives in the United States have become more distrusting of science, a trend that started in the 1970s. And a swath of recent research conducted by social and political psychologists has consistently shown that climate-change scepticism, in particular, is typically found among those on the conservative side of the political spectrum. However, there is more to science scepticism than just political ideology. No relation between political ideology and attitudes toward genetic modification has been found. Nor has any clear relation between political conservatism and vaccine scepticism found.

One of the take-home messages of studies that investigated science trust and science scepticism is that it is crucial not to lump various forms of science scepticism together. First, religiosity has so far been curiously under-researched as a precursor to science scepticism, perhaps because political ideology commanded so much attention. Second, current research lacks a systematic investigation into various forms of scepticism, alongside more general measures of trust in science.

When the aim is to combat scepticism and increase trust in science, a good starting point is to acknowledge that science scepticism comes in many forms. Political ideology, religiosity, morality and knowledge about science are four major predictors of science acceptance and science scepticism. These variables tend to intercorrelate – in some cases quite strongly – which means that they are potentially confounded. To illustrate, an observed relation between political conservatism and trust in science might in reality be caused by another variable, for example religiosity. So, the predictive value of none of these can be shown or verified in isolation.

Zebra finches, for example, seem to pay attention to pauses between notes on short time scales but have trouble recognising overarching rhythmic patterns—one of the key skills thought necessary for musical perception.

Instead of rhythm, birds may be analysing their peers' songs by the melody. A recent study found that European starlings (*Sturnus vulgaris*) distinguish shifting four-tone sequences by their "spectral shape", a statistical representation of all the frequencies in a sound most similar to timbre.
