- The move toward cost-recovery serves two purposes. First, the implementation of fees for some of the services offered by the public agricultural extension systems is expected to help with the budget constraint faced by agricultural extension by recovering part of the cost for providing these services. Second, the introduction of a fee-for-service system is expected to serve as an incentive for the development of a private consulting market for agricultural extension services.
- Commercialization of the public agricultural extension organizations: was being followed at a national level in New Zealand and at a regional level in Australia.
- Privatization of the public agricultural extension systems: United Kingdom, France, the Netherlands, and Ireland.
