APJ Abdul Kalam, popularly known as the "Missile Man of India," was an eminent scientist, educator, and statesman who served as the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007. He was born on 15th October 1931, in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu, India. His full name was Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam. PJ Abdul Kalam played a significant role in the development of India's missile program. He was instrumental in the design and development of the Agni, Prithvi, and Akash missiles, which made India self-sufficient in missile technology. Kalam was also the chief architect of India's nuclear weapon program, and he played a crucial role in the Pokhran-II nuclear tests conducted in 1998. He wrote books such as

- Wings of Fire
- Ignited Minds
- My Journey
- India 2020

Veerapandiya Kattabomman was the 47th ruler of Panchalankurinchi. Veerapandiya Kattabomman was an 18th century ruler who fought against the British rule in Tamil Nadu. He was one of the kings who opposed the British East India Company in South India. He was initially accused of tax evasion by the British and ignored repeated summons to meet Collector Jackson and later rebelled against the British who refused to pay taxes, resulting in the British East India Company sending an army under Major Bannerman to capture Kattabomman. On September 5, 1799, Panchalankurichi fort was besieged by an English commander named Bannermen. There was a fierce battle Many British officers lost their lives in the war. However, when the fort was about to fall, Veerapandiya Kattabomman left the fort. On October 1, 1799, Veerapandiya Kattabomman was arrested and handed over to the British by Pudukottai King Vijayaragunatha Thondaman. He was hanged and murdered at Kayathar on October 16, 1799. His 224th death anniversary is observed on October 16 throughout Tamil Nadu.
