Why in news?

Key Points:

- Valvil Ori was a Tamil king and skilled archer.
- He belongs to Vettuva gounder community, who ruled Kolli Hills region in present day Tamil Nadu.
- He was one of the Tamil Kadai ezhu vallal ('Last Seven Patrons').
- The Valvil Ori Festival is celebrated in the picturesque scenery of Kolli Hills every year during the Tamil month of Aadi (August to commemorate the great archer "Valvil Ori".

Tamil Pudhalvan scheme

Why in news?

Tamil Nadu emerges as India's
powerful patent house

Why in news?

According to Intellectual Property India's annual report 2022-23, Tamil Nadu occupies the first position with 7,686 patents, while Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh come in at second and third with 5,626 and 5,564, respectively.

Key Points:

- Intellectual property rights (IPR) are the legal privileges granted to the inventor or creator to safeguard their intellectual work (in the arts, sciences, literature, etc.) for a specific period of time.
- These are outlined in Article 27 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which grants the right to gain protection for one's material and moral interests.
- A patent gives the owner the authority to decide whether or how others may use an invention.
