





## **IIMR** to introduce rice-like millets



## Context:

- Indian Institute of Millets Research (IIMR) said that millets research has thrown up a variety of millets that look just like rice.
- Millets are being altered into the shape of rice, to attract those averse to consuming millets into eating these food grains.
- It is an initiative to earn more acceptability for the 3,000-year-old group of cereals.
- While reconstituting millets into rice, it can fortify them to address a particular nutritional demand for a particular set of consumers, and to increase the shelf-life and digestion

#### **About Millets:**

- India has been the largest producer of millets in the world
- It has 19 percent of the global area under millet cultivation
- India produces 11 out of 18 millets cultivated in 131 countries around the world.
- Millets could help prevent heart ailments, colon cancer, and type-2 diabetes
- It could also aid in weight loss
- Millets are gluten-free food which is good for pregnant and lactating mothers and prevents malnutrition in children.

# VIIth Nizam's reverse glass painting in Telangana



#### Context:

- A glass painting of the seventh Nizam Mir Osman Ali Khan is preserved in the Nizam's Museum in Purani Haveli.
- It is a unique and rare reverse glass painting made with precious and semi-precious stones, which was gifted by Queen Victoria to the Nizam in 1936.
- The painting was made by Glass Craft Company Limited which was based in London.
- Several types of precious stones which were powdered and mixed were used in the painting. For Example,.
  - To make the white pigment diamond, pearl and white lead were used









- For green color It was made using emerald, jade, turquoise, moss and agate.
- o The pink color It was made by combining ruby, cinnabar and spinel
- The yellow It was made of topaz, corundum and cats eye.
- o The sky blue color It was made using lapis lazuli
- The **black** - It was made of sang-e-musa and fine coal.

## Open Defecation Free (ODF) Strategy

- The Open Defecation Free (ODF) Plus Strategy is an extension of the ODF program, which was launched in 2014 with the goal of making India free from open defecation.

The ODF Plus Strategy focuses on the following key areas:

## 1. Solid and liquid waste management:

- The ODF Plus Strategy aims to ensure all solid and liquid waste generated in villages is managed in a safe and sustainable manner.
- This will involve the construction of individual household toilets, community toilets, and solid waste management facilities.

## 2. Sanitary behavior change:

- The ODF Plus Strategy will focus on promoting sanitary behavior change among communities.
- involve education and This will awareness campaigns, as well as the promotion of the use of toilets and handwashing facilities.

## 3. Capacity building:

The ODF Plus Strategy will focus on building the capacity of local communities and stakeholders manage and maintain sanitation infrastructure.
