What is the Self-Respect Movement and its significance?

- An emancipatory movement started in 1925 that aimed to empower individuals and communities to challenge oppressive hierarchical structures
- Promoted rational thinking, subaltern politics, women's rights, and social justice
- Closely associated with, but distinct from, the Dravidian Movement
- E.V. Ramasamy ('Periyar'): Conceptualized and led the movement for nearly 50 years
- C.N. Annadurai ('Anna'): Regarded as the political patriarch of contemporary Tamil Nadu

What were the major achievements of the Self-Respect Movement?

- Introduction and popularization of self-respect marriages
- Advocacy for women's liberation and rights
- Promotion of inter-caste marriages
- Contribution to the evolution of federalism in India

Russia's geopolitical pivot to Asia, a new India chapter

What led to Russia's economic pivot towards Asia in 2022?

- Moscow cut economic ties with Europe due to political tensions
- Russia aimed to reduce susceptibility to external shocks from Western markets
- The move was driven by geopolitical considerations and the need for economic stability

How has the India-Russia relationship evolved recently?

• Trade between India and Russia grew significantly despite lack of common borders

- Bilateral trade reached \$3.5 billion in June 2022 and \$7.5 billion in May 2024
- A bilateral trade target of \$100 billion by 2030 was announced

What factors have contributed to the growth in India-Russia ties?

- India's non-involvement in the European conflict provided stability for Russia
- Economic benefits for India, such as discounted oil imports and reduced food inflation
- Pragmatic approach from both sides, focusing on economic advantages

What challenges does the India-Russia relationship face?

- Lack of economic complementarity due to both countries' focus on domestic production
- Sanctions regime limiting opportunities to overcome trade imbalances
- Absence of stable payment mechanisms and clear arbitration systems
