### Self Help Group (SHG)

#### Why in news?

- To economically empower urban women and reduce poverty, the Andhra Pradesh Urban Poverty Alleviation Organisation (MEPMA) launched the Livelihoods & Entrepreneurship Acceleration Plan (LEAP) in Tadepalli.
- The initiative aims to develop one entrepreneur in every household, targets transformation of self-employed women

#### **Key Points:**

- A Self Help Group is a self-governed, peer-controlled information group of people with similar socio-economic backgrounds and a desire to collectively perform a common purpose.
- An SHG normally consists of not less than five persons (with a maximum of twenty) of similar economic outlook and social

  - SHG-Bank Linkage Programme (SBLP)

#### Archaeological Survey of India (ASI)

#### Why in news?

- Following the successful roof restoration at the historic Srikalahasteeswara Temple in Srikalahasti, similar eco-friendly repairs are scheduled to begin at the Srisailam Temple in the first week of Mav.
- The project, estimated at Rs 4 crore, aims to fix roof leakages and preserve the ancient architecture, with technical support from the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI).

#### **Key Points:**

- It was established in the year 1861 by **Alexander** Cunningham.
- ASI is responsible for archaeological research and the conservation and preservation of cultural monuments in the country.
- Its activities include carrying out surveys of antiquarian remains, exploration and excavation of archaeological sites, conservation and maintenance of protected monuments etc.
- **Concerned Ministry:** Ministry of Culture.

Srisailam Temple, or Sri Bhramaramba Mallikarjuna Swamy Temple, is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva, worshipped

Places in news: Amaravati	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>Amaravati, the envisioned capital of Andhra Pradesh, is set to host a significant event as Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu gets ready to perform the Bhoomi Puja for his personal residence.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points:         <ul> <li>The city of Amaravati is the legislative capital of Andhra Pradesh which lies close to the Krishna river and has a huge green landscape.</li> <li>It is on the southern banks of the Krishna river in Guntur district and is a recently constructed planned city after the Andhra Pradesh split.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>About Krishna River:         <ul> <li>In terms of water inflows and river basins, Krishna is the fourth largest river after Ganga, Godavari, and Brahmaputra.</li> <li>Total Length: 1300 km</li> <li>Its principal tributaries joining from the right are the Ghatprabha, the Malprabha, and the Tungabhadra, whereas those joining from the left are the Bhima, the Musi, and the Munneru.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Public-Private-People Partnership" (P4) Policy	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>The State government has intensified its efforts to establish a robust framework for the P4 (Public-Private-People Partnership) programme, aimed at achieving zero poverty.</li> <li>The government has set an ambitious target of facilitating the adoption of 5 lakh 'Golden Families' by August 15.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>'P4' stands for 'Public, Private, People Partnership', and achieving 'zero poverty' is one of the 'Padi Sutralu' (10 principles) of Swarna Andhra-2047.</li> <li>A "Public-Private-People Partnership" (P4) system is an expanded version of the traditional Public-Private Partnership (PPP).</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	ownership in both decision-making and the distribution of benefits.
Hepatitis	<ul> <li>Why in news?         <ul> <li>Health authorities in Konaseema district have reported a rise in hepatitis infections in Pallam village, following more than 10 days of ongoing fever cases and illnesses among residents.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Key Points:         <ul> <li>Hepatitis is inflammation of the liver.</li> <li>It can be an acute (short-term) infection or a chronic (long-term) infection.</li> </ul> </li> <li>There are different types of hepatitis, with different causes:         <ul> <li>Viral hepatitis: It is the most common type and caused by one of several hepatitis viruses A, B, C, D, and E.</li> <li>Alcoholic hepatitis which is caused by heavy alcohol use.</li> <li>Toxic hepatitis can be caused by certain poisons, chemicals, medicines, or supplements.</li> <li>Autoimmune hepatitis is a chronic type in which your body's immune system attacks your liver.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Common symptoms include: Fever, Fatigue, Loss of appetite, Nausea and/or vomiting etc.</li> </ul>
