	<ul> <li>Key Points:</li> <li>The new National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century in India, which replaces the previous National Policy on Education (NPE) 1986.</li> <li>The Ministry of Education formed a committee under Dr. K Kasturirangan, which outlined this new policy.</li> <li>The National Education Policy 2020 proposes various reforms in school and higher education, including technical education, that are suited to 21st-century needs.</li> <li>5 foundational pillars of NEP 2020: Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability, and Accountability.</li> </ul>

Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal (KWDT)	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>Citing Krishna as a deficit basin, Telangana Tribunal that Andhra Pradesh should use Godavari river water to meet its irrigation needs for second and third crops, as well as for outside-basin diversions.</li> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>In 1969, the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal (KWDT) was set up under the Inter-State River Water Dispute Act, 1956, and presented its report in 1973.</li> <li>At the same time, it was stipulated that the KWDT order may be reviewed or revised by a competent authority or tribunal any time after 31st May, 2000.</li> <li>The second KWDT was instituted in 2004. It delivered its report in 2010, which made allocations of the Krishna water at 65 % dependability and for surplus flows as follows: 81 TMC for Maharashtra, 177 TMC for Karnataka, and 190 TMC for Andhra Pradesh.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
